and he prepared for himself chariots and horsemen, and fifty [50] men to run before him. 6 (And his father had not rebuked him at any time by saying,

"Why have you done so?"

'It is your son Solomon who shall build My house and My courts; for I have chosen him to be My son, and I will be his Father. 7 Moreover I will establish his kingdom forever. if he is steadfast to observe My commandments and My judgments, as it is this day.' 8 [Cf. 2 Sa 7:12b-16] Now therefore. in the sight of all Israel, the assembly of YHWH, and in the hearing of our God, be careful to seek out all the commandments of Yhwh your God, that you may possess this good land, and leave *it* as an inheritance for your children after you forever. 9 As for you, my son Solomon, know the God of your father, and serve Him with a loyal heart and with a willing mind; for YHWH searches all hearts and understands all the intent of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will cast you off forever. 10 Consider **now**, for **Y**_{HWH} has chosen you to build a house for the sanctuary: be strong, and do it." 11¶ Then David gave his son Solomon the plans for

the vestibule. its houses. its treasuries. its upper chambers, its inner chambers, and the place of the mercy seat; 12 and the plans for all that he had *[planned]* by the Spirit, of the courts of the house of YHWH, of all the chambers all around. of the treasuries of the house of God. and of the treasuries for the dedicated things; 13 also for the division of the priests and the Levites, for all the work of the service of the house of YHWH, and for all the articles of service in the house of YHWH. 14 *He gave* gold by weight for *things* of gold, for all articles used in every kind of service; also silver for all articles of silver by weight, for all articles used in every kind of service; 15 the weight for the lampstands of gold and their lamps of gold, by weight for each lampstand and its lamps; for the lampstands of silver by weight. for the lampstand and its lamps, according to the use of each lampstand. 16 And by weight *he gave* gold for the tables of the showbread. for each table. and silver

for the tables of silver: 17 also pure gold for the forks. the basins. the pitchers of pure gold, and the golden bowls he gave gold by weight for every bowl; and for the silver bowls, *silver* by weight for every bowl; 18 and refined gold by weight for the altar of incense, and for the construction of the chariot. that is, the gold cherubim that spread their wings and overshadowed the ark of the covenant of YHWH. 19 "All this," said David, "Yhwh made me understand in writing. by *His* hand upon me, all the works of these plans." 20 And David said to his son Solomon. "Be strong and of good courage, and do *it*; do not fear nor be dismayed, for YHWH God — my God — will be with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you, until you have finished all the work for the service of the house of YHWH. 21 Here are the divisions of the priests and the Levites for all the service of the house of God: and every willing craftsman will be with you for all manner of workmanship, for every kind of service; also the leaders and all the people will be completely at your command."

2¶ He who walks in his uprightness fears YHWH. but He who is perverse in his ways despises Him. 3 ¶ In the mouth of a fool *is* a rod of pride, [*i.e.*, for self beating] But the lips of the wise will preserve them. 4¶ Where no oxen *are*, the trough *is* clean, but much increase *comes* by the strength of an ox. 5¶ A faithful witness does not lie, but A false witness will utter lies. 6¶ A scoffer seeks wisdom and does not find it, but knowledge is easy [to find] to Him who understands. 7¶ Go from the presence of a foolish man. when you do not perceive in him the lips of knowledge. 8¶ The wisdom of the prudent is to understand his way, but The folly of fools is deceit. 9 ¶ Fools mock at sin, but Among the upright *there is* favor. 10 ¶ The heart knows its own bitterness, and a stranger does not share its <mark>joy</mark>. 11¶

The house of the wicked will be overthrown, but The tent of the upright will flourish. 12¶ There is a way *that seems* right to a man, but its end is The way of death. 13¶ Even in laughter the heart may sorrow, and the end of mirth may be grief. 14¶ The backslider in heart will be filled with his own ways, but A good man *will be satisfied [filled]* from above. 15¶ The simple believes every word, but The prudent considers well his steps. 16¶ A wise *man* fears and departs from evil, but A fool rages and is self-confident. 17¶ A quick-tempered man acts foolishly, and A man of wicked intentions is hated. 18¶ The simple inherit folly, but The prudent are crowned with knowledge. 19¶ The evil will bow before the good, and The wicked, at the gates of the righteous. 20¶ The poor *man* is hated even by his own neighbor, but The rich has many "friends". 21 ¶ He who despises his neighbor sins, but He who has mercy on the poor, happy is he. 33 ¶ 22¶ Do they not go astray who devise evil? But mercy and truth belong to those who devise good. 23 ¶ In all labor there is profit, but

Idle chatter *leads* only to poverty.

24¶ The crown of the wise is their riches, but The foolishness of fools is folly. 25¶ A true witness delivers souls, but A deceitful *witness* speaks lies. 26¶ In the fear of YHWH there is strong confidence, and His children will have a place of refuge. 27 The fear of YHWH is a fountain of life.

34¶ **Righteousness** exalts a nation, but Sin *is* a reproach to *any* people. The king's favor is toward a wise servant, but His wrath is against him who causes shame.

Proverbs 15

15:1¶ A soft answer turns away wrath, but A harsh word stirs up anger. 2¶ The tongue of the wise uses knowledge rightly, but The mouth of fools pours forth foolishness. 3¶ The eyes of YHWH *are* in every place, Keeping watch on the evil and the good. A wholesome tongue is a tree of life, but Perverseness in it breaks the spirit. A fool despises his father's instruction, but He who receives correction is prudent. 6¶ *In* the house of the righteous *there is* much treasure, but In the revenue of the wicked is trouble. The lips of the wise disperse knowledge, but The heart of the fool *does* not *do* so. 8¶ The sacrifice of the wicked *is* an abomination to YHWH, but The prayer of the upright *is* His delight. 9 ¶ The way of the wicked is an abomination to YHWH, but He loves him who follows righteousness. 10¶ Harsh discipline is for him who forsakes the way, and He who hates correction will die. 11¶

The Grave [Hell] [Hebrew: sheol] and Destruction [cf. 27:20] are before YHWH; So how much more the hearts of the sons of men. 12¶ A scoffer does not love one who corrects him. Nor will he go to the wise. 13 ¶ A merry heart makes a cheerful countenance, but by sorrow of the heart The spirit is broken. 14¶ The heart of him who has understanding seeks knowledge, but The mouth of fools feeds on foolishness. 15 ¶ All the days of the afflicted are evil, but He who is of a merry heart has a continual feast. 16¶ Better *is* a little with the fear of YHWH, Than great treasure with trouble. 17 Better *is* a dinner of herbs where love is, Than a fatted calf with hatred. 18¶ A wrathful man stirs up strife, but *He* who is slow to anger allays contention. 19¶ The way of the lazy *man* is like a hedge of thorns, but The way of the upright *is* <mark>a highway</mark>. 20¶ A wise son makes a father glad, but A foolish man despises his mother. 21 ¶ Folly is joy to him *who is* destitute of discernment, but A man of understanding walks uprightly. 22¶ Without counsel, plans go awry, but In the multitude of counselors.

23 ¶ A man has joy by the answer of his mouth, and a word *spoken* in due season, How good *it is*! 24 ¶ The way of life *winds* upward for the wise, That he may turn away from the grave [hell] [Hebrew: sheol; the pit] below. 25¶ Yhwh will destrov the house of the proud, but He will establish the boundary of the widow. 26¶ The thoughts of the wicked are an abomination to YHWH, but The words of the pure *are* pleasant [to Him and others]. 27 ¶ He who is greedy for gain troubles his own house, but He who hates bribes will live. 28¶ The heart of the righteous studies how to answer, but The mouth of the wicked pours forth evil. 29 ¶ YHWH *is* far from the wicked, but He hears the prayer of the righteous. 30 ¶ The light of the eyes rejoices the heart; A good report makes the bones healthy. 31 ¶ The ear that hears the rebukes of life will abide among the wise. 32¶ He who disdains instruction despises his own soul, but He who heeds rebuke gets understanding. 33¶ The fear of YHWH is the instruction of wisdom, and Before honor is humility.

Proverbs 16 16:1¶ The preparations of the heart *belong* to man, but The answer of the tongue *is* from YHWH. 2¶ All the ways of a man *are* pure in his own eyes, but YHWH weighs the spirits. 3¶ Commit vour works to YHWH, and your thoughts will be established. 4¶ Yhwh has made all for Himself, yes, even the wicked for the day of doom. 5¶ Everyone proud in heart is an abomination to YHWH; Though they join forces, none will go unpunished. 6¶ In mercy and truth atonement is provided for iniquity; and by the fear of YHWH one departs from evil. 7¶ When a man's ways please YHWH, He makes even his enemies to be at peace with him. 8 ¶ Better *is* a little with righteousness, Than vast revenues without justice. A man's heart plans his way, but YHWH directs his steps. 10¶ Divine sentence²¹ is on the lips of the king; His mouth must not transgress in judgment. 11¶ Honest weights and scales *are* YHWH's: All the weights in the bag *are* His work.

12¶ *It is* an abomination for kings to commit wickedness, for A throne is established by righteousness. 13¶ Righteous lips *are* the delight of kings, and they love him who speaks what is right. 14¶ As messengers of death is the king's wrath, But a wise man will appease it. 15 In the light of the king's face is life, and His favor is like a cloud of the latter rain. 16¶ How much better to get wisdom than gold! And to get understanding is to be chosen rather than silver. 17¶ The highway of the upright *is* to depart from evil; He who keeps his way preserves his soul. 18¶ Pride goes before destruction, and A haughty spirit before a fall. 19¶ Better to be of a humble spirit with the lowly, Than to divide the spoil with the proud. 20¶ He who heeds the word wisely will find good, and Whoever trusts in YHWH, happy *is* he. 21 ¶ The wise in heart will be called prudent, and Sweetness of the lips increases learning. 22¶ Understanding is a wellspring of life to him who has it, but The correction of fools is folly. 23¶ The heart of the wise teaches his mouth, and adds learning to his lips.

He who mocks the poor reproaches his Maker; [cf. <u>14:31</u>] He who is glad at calamity will not go unpunished. 6¶ Children's children are the crown of old men, and the glory of children *is* their father. 7¶ Excellent speech is not becoming to a fool. much less lying lips to a prince. 8 ¶ A present is a precious stone in the eyes of its possessor; Wherever he turns, he prospers. 9¶ He who covers a transgression seeks love, but [cf. 16:28] He who repeats a matter separates friends. 10¶ Rebuke is more effective for a wise *man* Than a hundred blows on a fool. 11¶ An evil *man* seeks only rebellion; therefore A cruel messenger will be sent against him.

12¶ Let a man meet a bear robbed of her cubs. rather than a fool in his folly. 13¶ Whoever rewards evil for good, Evil will not depart from his house. 14¶ The beginning of strife *is like* releasing water; therefore Stop contention before a quarrel starts. 15¶ He who justifies the wicked, and He who condemns the just, both of them alike *are* An abomination to YHWH. 16¶ Why *is there* in the hand of a fool the purchase price of wisdom, Since *he has* no heart *for it*? 17¶ A friend loves at all times, and A brother is born for adversity. 18¶ A man devoid of understanding shakes hands in a pledge, and Becomes surety for his friend. 19¶ He who loves transgression loves strife, and He who exalts his gate seeks destruction. 20¶ He who has a deceitful heart finds no good, and He who has a perverse tongue falls into evil. 21¶ He who begets a scoffer does so to his sorrow, and The father of a fool has no joy. 22¶ A merry heart does good, like medicine, But a broken spirit dries the **bones**. [18:14] 23¶ A wicked man accepts a bribe behind the back To pervert the ways of justice. 24 ¶

Wisdom *is* in the sight of him who has understanding, but the eyes of a fool *are* on The ends of the land [earth]. 25¶ A foolish son is a grief to his father, and bitterness to her who bore him. 26¶ Also, to punish the righteous is not good, *Nor* to strike princes for *their* uprightness. 27¶ He who has knowledge spares his words, A man of understanding is of a calm spirit. 28 Even a fool is counted wise when he holds his peace; when he shuts his lips, *He is considered* perceptive. **Proverbs 18**

18:1¶ A man who isolates himself seeks his own desire; He rages against all wise judgment. 2¶ A fool has no delight in understanding, but in expressing his own heart. 3¶ When the wicked comes, contempt comes also; and With dishonor comes reproach. 4¶ The words of a man's mouth *are* deep waters: The wellspring of wisdom is a flowing brook. 5¶ It is not good to show partiality to the wicked, or to overthrow the righteous in judgment. 6 ¶ A fool's lips enter into contention, and his mouth calls for blows. 7 A fool's mouth is his destruction, and his lips are the snare of his soul. 8¶ Highlighting Legend & Lates Notes

And *he who* speaks lies shall perish. 10¶ Luxury is not fitting for a fool, much less *[is it fitting]* For a servant to rule over princes. 11¶ The discretion of a man makes him slow to anger, and His glory *is* to overlook a transgression. 12¶ The king's wrath *is* like the roaring of a lion, but His favor is like dew on the grass. 13¶ A foolish son is the ruin of his father, and The contentions of a wife are a **continual** dripping. 14¶ Houses and riches *are* an inheritance from fathers, but a prudent wife is from YHWH. 15¶ Laziness casts one into a deep sleep, and An idle person will suffer hunger. 16¶ He who keeps the commandment keeps his soul, but He who is careless of his ways will die. 17¶ He who has pity on the poor lends to YHWH, and He will pay back what he has given. 18¶

Chasten your son while there is hope, and Do not set your heart on his destruction. 19¶ A man of great wrath will suffer punishment; For if you rescue him, vou will have to do it again. 20¶ Listen to **counsel** and receive **instruction**. That you may be wise in your latter days. 21¶ There are many plans in a man's heart, nevertheless. "It is good for nothing", cries the buyer; But when he has gone his way, then he boasts. There is gold and a multitude of rubies. But the lips of knowledge *are* a precious jewel. Take the garment of one who is surety for a stranger, and Hold it as a pledge *when it* is for a seductress. Bread gained by deceit is sweet to a man, but afterward His mouth will be filled with gravel. Plans are established by counsel: by wise counsel Wage war. He who goes about as a talebearer reveals secrets: therefore do not associate with One who flatters with his lips. Whoever curses his father or his mother: His lamp will be put out in deep darkness. An inheritance gained hastily at the beginning Will not be blessed at the end. 22¶ [De 32:35 \rightarrow Ro 12:19, He 10:30] Do not say, "I will recompense evil";

Diverse weights *are* [cf. v10] an abomination to YHWH, and Dishonest scales are not good. 24 ¶ A man's steps *are* of YHWH; how then can a man understand his own way? 25¶ It is a snare for a man to devote rashly *something as* holy, and afterward to reconsider his vows. 26¶ A wise king sifts out the wicked, and brings the threshing wheel over them. 27¶ The spirit of a man is the lamp of Yhwh, searching all the inner depths of his heart. 28¶ Mercy and truth preserve the king, and by lovingkindness he upholds his throne. 29¶ The glory of young men *is* their strength, and The splendor of old men *is* their gray head. 30 ¶ Blows that hurt cleanse away evil, as do Stripes the inner depths of the heart. **Proverbs 21** 21:1¶ The king's heart *is* in the hand of YHWH; *like* the rivers of water, He turns it wherever He wishes. 2¶ Every way of a man is right in his own eyes, but [cf. 12:15; De 12:8; Jud 17:6, 21:25] YHWH weighs the hearts. 3 ¶ To do righteousness and justice *is* more acceptable to YHWH than sacrifice.

15¶ 27 ¶ It is a joy for the just to do justice, but Destruction will come to the workers of iniquity. 16¶ 28 ¶ A man who wanders from the way of understanding will rest in the assembly of the dead. 29¶ 17¶ He who loves pleasure *will be* a poor man; He who loves wine and oil will not be rich. 18¶ 30¶ The wicked shall be a ransom for the righteous, and The unfaithful for the upright. 19¶ Better to dwell in the wilderness. Than with a contentious and angry woman. 20¶ There is desirable treasure, and oil in the dwelling of the wise, but A foolish man squanders it. 21¶ He who follows righteousness and mercy 2¶ Finds life, righteousness, and honor. 22¶ A wise *man* scales [the walls of] the city of the mighty, 3 ¶ And brings down the trusted stronghold. 23¶ Whoever guards his mouth and tongue Keeps his soul from troubles. 4¶ 24 ¶ By A proud *and* haughty *man* — "Scoffer" *is* his name: Are He acts with arrogant pride. 5¶ 25¶ The desire of the lazy man kills him, for his hands refuse to labor; 26 he covets greedily all day long, but The righteous gives and does not spare.

Thorns and snares are in the way of the perverse; he who guards his soul will be far from them [thorns, snares].

A fierce lion is in the streets!" 14 ¶ As a door turns on its hinges, So does the lazy man on his bed. 15¶ The lazy *man* buries his hand in the bowl; It wearies him to bring it back to his mouth. 16¶ The lazy *man* is wiser in his own eyes than seven men who can answer sensibly. 17¶ He who passes by

and meddles in a quarrel not his own is like one who takes a dog by the ears.

Like a madman who throws firebrands, arrows, and death, 19 is the man who deceives his neighbor, and says, "I was only joking!" 20¶ Where *there is* no wood, the fire goes out; and Where *there is* no talebearer, strife ceases. As charcoal is to burning coals, and wood to fire. So *is* a contentious man to kindle strife. 22 The words of a talebearer are like tasty trifles, and They go down into the inmost body. 23¶ Fervent lips with a wicked heart are like earthenware covered with silver dross. 24 ¶ He who hates. disguises it with his lips, and lavs up deceit within himself: 25 When he speaks kindly, do not believe him. for there are seven abominations in his heart; 26 Though his hatred is covered by deceit, His wickedness will be revealed before the assembly. 27 ¶ Whoever digs a pit will fall into it, and He who rolls a stone will have it roll back on him. 28¶

Do not take your stand for an evil thing, for he does whatever pleases him." Where the word of a king *is*, *there is* power; and

who may say to him, "What are you doing?" 5 He who keeps his command will experience nothing harmful; and A wise man's heart discerns

The Wicked and the Righteous

9¶ All this I have seen, and applied my heart to every work that is done under the sun:

There is a time in which one man rules over another to his own hurt.

Then I saw the wicked buried, who had come and gone from the place of holiness, and they were forgotten in the city where they had so done. This also *is* vanity.

Because

the sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily,

Therefore

the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil.

a sinner does evil a hundred *times*, and his *days* are prolonged, yet I surely know that it will be well with those who fear God, who fear before Him; 13 but it will not be well with the wicked; nor will he prolong *his* days, *which are* as a shadow, because he does not fear before God.

So I commended enjoyment, because a man has nothing better under the sun than to eat, drink, and be merry; for this will remain with him in his labor *all* the days of his life **that** God gives him under the sun. 16

When I applied my heart to know wisdom and to see the business that is done on land [earth], even though one sees no sleep day or night, 17 then I saw all the work of God, that a man cannot find out the work that is done under the sun. For: though a man labors to discover *it*, yet he will not find *it*; moreover, though a wise *man* attempts to know *it*, he will not be able to find *it*.

No man knows what is to be; Who can tell him what will happen [be] after him? 15 The labor of fools wearies them. For they do not even know how to go to the city! 16¶ Woe to you, O land, when your king is a child, and your princes feast in the morning!17 Blessed are you, O land, when your king is the son of nobles, and your princes feast at the proper time:

Do this, and you will not be guilty. 11 And take notice: Amariah ["Yuwh speaks (has prom*ised*) "] the chief priest *is* over you in all matters of YHWH: and Zebadiah ["YHWH's endowment"] the son of Ishmael ["God will hear"], the ruler of the house of Judah. for all the king's matters; also the Levites will be officials before you. Behave courageously, and YHWH will be with the good."

besides the Ammonites. came to battle against Jehoshaphat. 2 Then some came and told Jehoshaphat, saying,

"A great multitude is coming against you from beyond the sea, from Syria; and they are in Hazazon Tamar

["dividing the date-palm"] (which

is En Gedi ["fount of the kid"])." 3 And Jehoshaphat feared, and set himself to seek YHWH, and proclaimed a fast throughout all Judah. 4 So Judah gathered together to ask *help* from YHWH; and from all the cities of Judah they came to seek YHWH. 5 Then Jehoshaphat stood in the assembly of Judah and Jerusalem, in the house of YHWH. before the new court, 6 and said:

"O YHWH God of our fathers, are You not God in heaven, and do You not rule over all the kingdoms of the nations, and in Your hand is there not power and might, so that no one is able to withstand You? 7

Are You not our God, who drove out the inhabitants of this land before Your people Israel, and gave it to the descendants of Abraham Your friend forever? 8 And they dwell in it, and have built You a sanctuary in it for Your name, saying, 9

'If disaster comes upon us sword, judgment, pestilence, or famine ---

Moab, and Mount Seir whom You would not let Israel invade when they came out of the land of Egypt, but they turned from them and did not destroy them — 11 here they are, rewarding us by coming to throw us out of Your possession that You have given us to inherit. 12 O our God, will You not judge them? For we have no power against this great multitude that is coming against us: nor do we know what to do, but our eves *are* upon You." 13 Now all Judah, with their little ones. their wives, and their children, stood before YHWH. 14 ¶ Then the Spirit of YHWH came upon Jahaziel ["God-beheld"] the son of Zechariah ["YHWH remembers"], the son of Benaiah ["YHWH has built (up)"], the son of Jeiel ["God sweeps away"], the son of Mattaniah ["gift of YHWH"], a Levite of the sons of Asaph ["gatherer"], in the midst of the assembly. 15

"Listen, all you of Judah and vou inhabitants of Jerusalem, and vou, King Jehoshaphat! Thus says YHWH to you: 'Do not be afraid nor dismayed because of this great multitude, for the battle *is* not yours, but God's. were saying: 16 **Tomorrow** go down against them. They will surely come up by the Ascent of Ziz ["flower"], and you will find them at the end of the brook before the Wilderness of Jeruel ["God taught"]. 17 You will not *need* to fight in this *battle*. of Position yourselves, Stand still, and See the salvation of Y_{HWH}. who is with you. O [people of] Judah and Jerusalem! Do not fear or be dismayed; tomorrow go out against them, for YHWH *is* with you." 18 And Jehoshaphat bowed his head with his face to the ground, and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem bowed before YHWH, worshiping YHWH. 19 Then the Levites of the children of the Kohathites and of the children of the Korahites stood up to praise YHWH God of Israel with voices loud and high. 20 So they rose early in the morning and went out into the Wilderness of Tekoa ["a stockade"]; and as they went out, Jehoshaphat stood and said, "Hear me, O *[people of]* Judah and

you inhabitants of Jerusalem: Believe [trust] in YHWH your God, and you shall be established;

Believe [trust] His prophets, and you shall prosper." 21 And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed those who should sing to YHWH, and who should praise the beauty of holiness. as they went out before the army and "Praise YHWH, For His mercy endures forever." 22 Now when they began to sing and to praise, YHWH set ambushes against the people Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir. who had come against Judah; and they were defeated. 23 For the people of Ammon and Moab stood up against the inhabitants of Mount Seir to utterly kill and destroy them. And when they had made an end of the inhabitants of Seir, they helped to

destroy one another. 24 So when Judah came to a place overlooking the wilderness, they looked toward the multitude; [36 is the last chapter of 2Ch] and there were their dead bodies, fallen on the ground [earth]. No one had escaped. 25 When Jehoshaphat and his people came to take away their spoil, they found among them an abundance Forward to: 2 Kings of valuables on the dead bodies, and precious jewelry, which they stripped off for themselves, more than they could carry away; and they were three [3] days gathering the spoil because

there was so much. 26 And on the fourth [4th] day they assembled in the Valley of Berachah ["blessing"; near *Tekoa* (*no map*)], for there they blessed YHWH: therefore the name of that place was called The Valley of Berachah until this day. 27 Then they returned, every man of Judah and Jerusalem, with Jehoshaphat in front of them, to go back to Jerusalem with ioy, for YHWH had made them rejoice over their enemies. 28 So they came to Jerusalem, with stringed instruments and harps and

trumpets,

to the house of YHWH. 29 And the fear of God was on all the kingdoms of *those* countries when they heard that YHWH had fought against the enemies of Israel. 30

Then the realm of Jehoshaphat was quiet, for his God gave him rest all around.

ⁱⁱ Proverbs is a collection of wisdom sayings; wisdom literature (e.g., the writings of Solomon, Job); almost just common sense. The Hebrews knew there were three ways to get guidance:

the Law (taught by the priests), the prophets (then live), and wise men.

Knowledge: facts;

Wisdom: how to use those facts to reach a goal, and what is a good goal to choose. In Proverbs, "fool"/"simple" doesn't refer to mental ability, but to not taking YHWH into consideration ("the fear of YHWH is the beginning of knowledge"). Proverbs are not commands but rules of thumb that are general in nature, and sometimes seemingly contradictary, suggesting that wisdom is needed to choose. Proverbs are not promises.

ⁱⁱⁱ First mention of Simeon since the transition from David to Solomon. Simeon's position in the divided kingdom is a mystery. Though their territory was in the midst of Judah, 2Ch 15:9 seems to say they came over from the northern kingdom to join Asa. Simeon is never mentioned as being part of the Judean kingdom, and the northern kingdom is always referred to as being comprised of "ten tribes".

Commentators have suggested that Simeon may have greatly diminished as a tribe, but no one has made clear when this happened. Re 7:7 includes the Simeonites among the 144,000, but this prophecy is sufficiently symbolic as to raise questions as to the passage's intention of affirming 12,000 of the tribe of Simeon actually existing at the time.

The passage in 2Ch 15:9 refers to "great numbers" of people in the time of Asa although the great numbers might simply mean the combined numbers from the three tribes mentioned, which may only have included relatively few Simeonites.

It is the geographical location of Simeon that causes the mystery. Given the original boundaries given to them by Joshua, it does seem as if they would have been a part of Judah after the division. It is possible (though entirely conjecture) that their numbers dwindled so greatly that they abandoned their territory (which was small to begin with), prior to Rehoboam's time, and migrated as individual families into various territories of the northern tribes. This may be what was implied in Jacob's prediction: "I will divide them in Jacob, and scatter them in Israel." (Gen.49:7).
