42:1 ¶ ◀To the Chief Musician.

A Contemplation of the sons of Korah. ▶

As the deer pants for the water brooks,
So pants my soul for You, O God. 2
My soul thirsts for God,
for the living God.
When shall I come
and appear before God? 3

My tears have been my food day and night,
While they continually say to me,
“Where is your God?” 4

When I remember these things,
I pour out my soul within me.
For I used to go with the multitude;
I went with them to the house of God,
With the voice of joy and praise,
With a multitude
that kept a pilgrim feast. 5

Why are you cast down, O my soul? And
Why are you disquieted within me?
Hope in God, for I shall yet praise Him
For the help of His countenance.

6 ¶
O my God, my soul is cast down within me;
Therefore I will remember You
from the land of the Jordan, and
from the heights of Hermon,
from the Hill Mizar [“small”]. 7

Deep calls unto deep
at the noise of Your waterfalls;
All Your waves and billows
have gone over me. 8

The LORD will command
His lovingkindness
in the daytime, and
in the night

His song shall be with me —
A prayer to the God of my life. 9
I will say to God my Rock,

“Why have You forgotten me?
Why do I go mourning
because of the oppression
of the enemy?” 10

As with a breaking of my bones,
My enemies reproach me,
While they say to me all day long,
“Where is your God?” 11

Why are you cast down, O my soul? And
Why are you disquieted within me?
Hope in God; for I shall yet praise Him,
The help of my countenance and my God.

Vindicate me, O God, and
Plead my cause against an ungodly nation;
Oh, deliver me
from the deceitful and unjust man! 2
For You are the God of my strength;
Why do You cast me off?
Why do I go mourning
because of the oppression
of the enemy? 3

Oh, send out Your light and Your truth!
Let them lead me;
Let them bring me

to Your holy hill and
to Your tabernacle. 4

Then I will go
to the altar of God,
to God my exceeding joy;
And on the harp I will praise You,
O God, my God. 5

Why are you cast down, O my soul? And
Why are you disquieted within me?
Hope in God; for I shall yet praise Him,
The help of my countenance and my God.

Psalm 44

We Have Heard ..., O God

44:1 ¶ ◀To the Chief Musician.

A Contemplation of the sons of Korah. ▶

We have heard with our ears, O God,
Our fathers have told us,
The deeds You did
in their days,
In days of old: 2
You drove out the nations with
Your hand, but them
You planted;
You afflicted the peoples, and
cast them out. 3

For they
did not gain possession of the land
by their own sword,
nor did their own arm save them;
But it was
Your right hand,
Your arm, and
the light of Your countenance,
Because You favored them. 4
You are my King, O God;
Command victories for Jacob. 5
Through You
we will push down
our enemies;
Through Your name
we will trample
those who rise up against us. 6
For I will not trust in my bow,
nor shall my sword save me. 7
But You
have saved us from
our enemies, and
have put to shame
those who hated us. 8
In God we
boast all day long, and
praise Your name forever.
Selah 9 ¶ But
You
have cast us off and
put us to shame, and
You
do not go out with our armies. 10
You
make us turn back from
the enemy, and
those who hate us
have taken spoil for themselves. 11
You
have given us up
like sheep intended for food, and
have scattered us
among the nations. 12
You
sell Your people for next to nothing, and
are not enriched by selling them. 13

You make us
 a reproach
 to our neighbors,
 a scorn and
 a derision
 to those all around us. 14

You make us
 a byword
 among the nations,
 a shaking of the head
 among the peoples. 15

My dishonor *is* continually before me, and
 The shame of my face has covered me, 16
 Because of the voice of
 him who reproaches and reviles,
 Because of
 the enemy and
 the avenger.

17 ¶
 All this has come upon us;
 But we have not forgotten You,
 Nor have we dealt falsely
 with **Your covenant**. 18

Our heart has not turned back,
 Nor have our steps departed
 from **Your way**; 19

But You have severely
 broken us in the place of jackals, and
 covered us with the shadow of death. 20

If we
 had forgotten
the name of our God, or
 stretched out our hands to
 a foreign **god**, 21

Would not **God** search this out?
 For He knows the secrets of the heart. 22
[Quoted by Paul in Ro 8:36]

Yet for Your sake
we are killed all day long;
we are accounted
as sheep for the slaughter. 23

Awake! Why do You sleep, O **LORD**?
 Arise! Do not cast *us* off forever. 24

Why do You
 hide **Your face**, *and*
 forget
 our affliction and
 our oppression? 25

For
 our soul is bowed down to the dust;
 our body clings to the ground. 26

Arise for our help, and
 Redeem us, for **Your mercies' sake**.

Psalm 45
My Heart is Overflowing

45:1 ¶ <To the Chief Musician.
 Set to "The Lillies."
 A Contemplation of
 the sons of Korah.
 A Song of Love.>

Concerning the Messiah, the King

My heart is overflowing
 with a good theme;
 I recite my composition
 concerning the **King**;
 My tongue *is* the pen of a ready writer. 2

You are fairer than the sons of men;
 Grace is poured upon **Your lips**;
 Therefore **God** has blessed You forever. 3

Gird
Your sword upon **Your thigh**,
 O **Mighty One**, with
Your glory and
Your majesty. 4 And in
Your majesty

Ride prosperously because of
 truth,
 humility, *and*
 righteousness; and
Your right hand shall teach You
 awesome things. 5

Your arrows *are* sharp
 in the heart of the **King's** enemies;
 The peoples fall under You.

6 ¶ **[vv6-7: Quoted in Heb 1:8-9]**

Your throne, O **God**, *is* forever and ever;
 A scepter of righteousness *is*
 the scepter of **Your kingdom**. 7

You
 love righteousness and
 hate wickedness;
 Therefore **God**, **Your God**,
 has anointed You with
 the oil of gladness
 more than **Your companions**. 8

All **Your garments** *are* scented with
 myrrh and aloes *and* cassia,
 out of the ivory palaces,
 by which they have made You glad. 9

Kings' daughters *are* among
Your honorable women;
 At **Your right hand** stands the queen in
 gold from **Ophir**.

10 ¶
 Listen, O daughter,
 Consider and incline your ear;
 Forget
 your own people also, and
 your father's house; 11

So the **King** will greatly desire your beauty;
 Because He *is* **your LORD**, **worship Him**. 12

And
 The daughter of Tyre
will come with a gift;
 The rich among the people
 will seek your favor. 13

The royal daughter
is all glorious within *the palace*;
 Her clothing *is* woven with gold. 14

She shall be brought to the **King**

God *is*
 our refuge and strength,
 a very present help in trouble. 2

Therefore we will not fear,
 Even though the land [earth] be
 removed,
 And though the mountains be
 carried into the midst of the sea;
though its waters
 roar *and*
 be troubled,
though the mountains
 shake with its swelling.

Selah 4
 There *is* a river whose streams
 shall make glad
the city of God,
 the holy *place* of the tabernacle
 of **the Most High**. 5

God *is* in the midst of her,
 she shall not be moved;
God shall help her,
 just at the break of dawn.

6 ¶
 The nations raged,
 the kingdoms were moved;
 He uttered **His voice**,
 the land [earth] melted. 7

A Psalm of the sons of Korah. ▶

Oh, clap your hands, all you peoples!
Shout to **God** with the voice of triumph! 2
For **the LORD Most High** is awesome;
He is a great King over all the land [earth]. 3
He will subdue
the peoples under us, and
the nations under our feet. 4

He will choose our inheritance for us,
The excellence of Jacob whom He loves.

Selah 5 ¶

God has gone up
with a shout;

The LORD,

with the sound of a trumpet. 6

Sing praises to **God**, sing praises!

Sing praises to **our King**, sing praises! 7

For **God is the King** of all the land [earth];

Sing praises with understanding. 8

God reigns over the nations;

God sits on **His holy throne**. 9

The princes of the people
have gathered together —

The people of **the God of Abraham**.
For the shields [*kings*] of the land [earth]
belong to **God**;
He is greatly exalted.

48:1 ¶ ◀A Song.

A Psalm of the sons of Korah. ▶

Great *is* **the LORD**, and

Greatly to be praised

In **the city of our God**,

In **His holy mountain**. 2

Beautiful in elevation,

The joy of the whole land [earth],

Is **Mount Zion** on

the sides of the north [*n. side?*],

The city of the great King. 3

God *is* in her palaces;

He is known as her refuge. 4

For behold,

The kings assembled,

They passed by together. 5

They saw *it*, and so

They marveled;

They were troubled,

They hastened away. 6

Fear took hold of them there, and

Pain, as of a woman in birth pangs, 7

as when You break

the ships of **Tarshish**

with an east wind.

As we have heard,

So we have seen

In **the city of the LORD of hosts**,

In **the city of our God**:

God will establish *it* forever.

Selah 9

We have thought, O **God**,

On **Your lovingkindness**,

In the midst of **Your temple**. 10

So *is* **Your praise**

Let Mount Zion rejoice,

Let the daughters of Judah be glad,

Because of **Your judgments**. 12

A Psalm of the sons of Korah. ▶

Hear this, all peoples;

Give ear, all inhabitants of the world, 2

both low and high,

rich and poor together: 3

my mouth shall speak wisdom,

and the meditation of

my heart *shall give* understanding. 4

I will incline my ear to a proverb;

I will disclose my dark saying on the harp. 5

Why should I fear in the days of evil,

When the iniquity at my heels

surrounds me?

6 ¶

Those who

trust in their wealth and

boast in the multitude of their riches, 7

None *of them*

can by any means redeem **his brother**,

Nor give to **God** a ransom for **him** — 8

For the redemption of their souls
is costly, and it
shall cease forever — 9

That **he** should

continue to live eternally, and
not see the pit [*i.e., the grave*]. 10

For **he** sees wise men die;

Likewise the fool and the senseless person
perish, and

leave their wealth to others. 11

Their inner thought *is that*

their houses *will last* forever,
their dwelling places to all generations;

They call *their* lands

after their own names. 12

Nevertheless man, *though* in honor,

does not remain;

He *is like the beasts that perish*. 13

This is the way [*fate*]

of those who *are* foolish, and

of their posterity [*followers*]

who approve their sayings.

Like sheep they are laid in

the grave;

death

Shall feed on them;

The upright shall have

dominion over them

in the morning; and

their beauty shall be

consumed

in **the grave**,

far from their dwelling.

15 ¶

But **God**

will redeem my soul

from **the power of the grave**,

For He

shall receive me.

Do not be afraid when one becomes rich,

When the glory of his house is increased; 17

For when he dies he shall carry nothing away;

His glory shall not descend after him. 18

Though while he lives he blesses himself
(For men will praise you
when you do well for yourself), 19
He shall go to the generation of his fathers;
They shall never see light. 20
A man *who is* in honor,
yet does not understand,
Is like the beasts that perish.

How lovely is Your tabernacle,
O LORD of hosts! 2
My soul longs, yes, even faints
for the courts of the LORD;
My heart and my flesh cry out
for the living God. 3

Even
the sparrow has found a home, and
the swallow a nest for herself,
Where she may lay her young —

Even Your altars,
O LORD of hosts,
My King and
My God. 4
Blessed are
those who dwell in Your house;
they will still be praising You.

Selah 5
Blessed is the man
whose strength is in You,
whose heart is set on pilgrimage. 6

As they pass through
the Valley of Baca [“weeping”],

The rain also covers it with pools. 7
They go from strength to strength;
Each one appears before God in Zion.

8 ¶
O LORD God of hosts,
hear my prayer;

look upon the face of Your anointed. 10

For
a day in Your courts
is better than
a thousand.
I would
rather be a doorkeeper
in the house of my God
than dwell
in the tents of wickedness. 11

For
the LORD God is a sun and shield;
the LORD will give grace and glory;
No good thing will He withhold
from those who walk uprightly. 12

O LORD of hosts,
blessed is the man who trusts in You!

85:1 ¶ ◀To the Chief Musician.
A Psalm of the sons of Korah.▶

LORD,
You have been favorable to
Your land;
You have brought back
the captivity [captives] of Jacob. 2
You have forgiven
the iniquity of Your people;
You have covered
all their sin.

Selah 3
You have taken away
all Your wrath;
You have turned from
the fierceness of Your anger. 4
Restore us, O God of our salvation, and
Cause Your anger toward us to cease. 5
Will You be angry with us forever?
Will You prolong Your anger
to all generations? 6

Will You not revive us again,
that Your people may rejoice in You? 7
Show us Your mercy, LORD, and
Grant us Your salvation.

8 ¶
I will hear what GOD the Lord
[YHWH Adonai] will speak,
For He will speak peace
to His people and
to His saints;
But let them not turn back to folly. 9
Surely His salvation is near
to those who fear Him,
that glory may dwell in our land. 10
Mercy and truth have met together;
Righteousness and peace have kissed. 11
Truth shall spring
out of the land [earth], and
Righteousness shall look
down from heaven. 12

Yes, the LORD will give what is good;

Blessed is the Man

1:1 ¶
Blessed *is* the man who walks
Not in the counsel of the ungodly,
Nor stands in the path of sinners,
Nor sits in the seat of the scornful;²
But
His delight *is*
in **the law of the LORD**, and
in **His law**
He meditates day and night. ³
He shall be like a tree
Planted by the rivers of water,
That brings forth its fruit in its season,
Whose leaf also shall not wither; and
Whatever he does shall prosper.
4 ¶
The ungodly
are not so, but
are like the chaff
that the wind drives away. ⁵
Therefore
The ungodly
shall not stand
in the judgment,
Nor sinners
in the congregation
of the righteous. ⁶
For **the LORD** knows
the way of the righteous, but
the way of the ungodly
Shall perish.

Why do the Nations Rage

2:1 ¶
Why do
the nations rage, and
the people plot a vain thing? ²
The kings of the lands [earth]
set themselves, and

The rulers
take counsel together,
Against **the LORD** and
Against **His Anointed** [Messiah/Christ],
saying, ³
“Let us break **their bonds** in pieces and
cast away **their cords** from us.” ⁴
He who sits in the heavens shall
laugh;
The LORD shall
hold them in derision. ⁵
Then He shall
speak to them in **His wrath**, and
distress them in **His deep displeasure**; ⁶
“Yet I have set **My King** [Messiah/Christ]
On My holy hill of Zion.”
7 ¶ [Quoted by Paul in Acts 13:33b]
“I will declare the decree:
The LORD has said to Me,
‘You are My Son, [Q’d in He 1:5, 5:5]
Today I have begotten You. ⁸
Ask of Me, and
I will give You
The nations
for Your inheritance, and
the ends of the lands [earth]
for Your possession. ⁹
You shall break them [Q’d in Rev 2:27]
with a rod of iron;
You shall dash them to pieces
like a potter’s vessel.”
10 ¶
Now therefore,
be wise,
O kings;
be instructed,
you judges of the lands [earth]. ¹¹
Serve **the LORD** with fear, and
Rejoice with trembling. ¹²
Kiss **the Son**, lest
He be angry, and
you perish *in* the way,
When **His wrath** is kindled but a little.
Blessed *are* all those
who put their trust in Him.

Why Do You Stand Far Off?

10:1 ¶
Why do You stand afar off, O **LORD**?
Why do You hide in times of trouble? ²
The wicked in *his* pride
persecutes the poor;
Let them be caught in the plots
that they have devised. ³ For
The wicked
boasts of his heart’s desire;
He blesses the greedy *and*
renounces **the LORD**. ⁴
The wicked in his proud countenance
does not seek
God; **God is**
in none of his thoughts. ⁵
His ways are always prospering;
Your judgments are
far above,
out of his sight;
As for all his enemies,
He sneers at them. ⁶
He has said in his heart,
“I shall not be moved;
I shall never be in adversity.” ⁷
His mouth is full of
cursing and
deceit and
oppression;
Under his tongue *is*
trouble and
iniquity. ⁸
He sits
in the lurking places of the villages;
in the secret places
He murders the innocent;
His eyes are
secretly fixed on the helpless. ⁹

He lies in wait
secretly, as a lion in his den;
He lies in wait
to catch the poor;
He catches the poor
when he draws him into his net. ¹⁰
So he crouches, he lies low,
That the helpless may fall by his strength. ¹¹
He has said in his heart,
“**God has forgotten;**
He hides His face;
He will never see.”
12 ¶
Arise,
O **LORD!**
O **God,**
Lift up **Your hand!**
Do not forget the humble. ¹³
Why do the wicked renounce **God**?
He has said in his heart,
“**You will not require an account.**” ¹⁴
But You have seen,
for You observe trouble and grief,
to repay *it* by Your hand.
The helpless commits himself to You;
You are the helper of the fatherless. ¹⁵
Break the arm of
the wicked and
the evil *man*;
Seek out his wickedness
until You find none. ¹⁶
The LORD is King forever and ever;
The nations have perished out of **His land**. ¹⁷
LORD,
You have heard the desire of the humble;
You will prepare their heart;
You will cause **Your ear** to hear, ¹⁸
To do justice to
the fatherless and
the oppressed,
That the man of the land [earth]
may oppress no more.
