

But when she could no longer hide him, she took an ark of bulrushes for him. daubed it with asphalt and pitch, put the child in it, and laid it in the reeds by the river's bank *[technically doing as* Pharaoh had commanded, casting him *into the river*]. 4 And his sister [Miriam: 15:20] stood afar off, to know [learn] what would be done to him.

And he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his brethren. 12 So he looked this way and that way, and when he saw no one, he killed the Egyptian and hid him in the sand. 13 And when he went out the second day, behold, two Hebrew men were fighting, and 5¶ Then the daughter of Pharaoh came he said to the one who did the wrong, "Why are you striking

your companion?" 14

Then he said,

"Who made you a prince and a judge over us? Do you intend to kill me as you killed the Egyptian?"

So Moses feared and said,

"Surely this thing is known!" 15

When Pharaoh heard of this matter, he sought to kill Moses. But Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh and dwelt in the land of Midian ["strife"; founded remembered His covenant by a son of Abraham and Keturah (Ge 25:2); southern Arabia]; and he sat down by a well.

And the years of the life of Levi were one hundred and thirty-seven. [137, in 2328 AB (Ge 30:24-25), 126 years before the exodus (12:41).] [So why are only the years of Levi, his son Kohath, and his grandson Amran given? Because they were 3 of the 4 generations in Ge 15:16.] [ cf. 1Ch 23:7] 17 The sons of Gershon were Libni ["white"] and Shimi ["renowned"] according to their families. 18 And the sons of Kohath were Amram ["exalted people"], Izhar ["shinning oil"], Hebron ["association"], and Uzziel ["God is my strength"]. 1 Chronicles 6:2 [cf. 1Ch 23:12] 2 The sons of Kohath were Amram, Izhar, Hebron, and Uzziel. And the vears of the life of Kohath were one hundred and thirty-three [133; dying perhaps 100 yrs or so before the exodus?]. [ , cf. <u>1Ch 23:21a</u>] 19 The sons of Merari were Mahali ["sick"] and Mushi ["yielding"].

On the first day [the 15th] there shall be "Pick out and take lambs for yourselves a holy convocation, and [5 days in between, then] on the seventh day  $(21^{st})$  there shall be a holy convocation for you. cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he is a stranger [Gentile] or a native of the land [Israelite]. 20 You shall eat nothing leavened;

in all your dwellings you shall eat unleavened bread.""

21 Then Moses called for all the elders so they did. of Israel and said to them.

according to your families, and kill the Passover lamb. 22 And you shall take a bunch of hyssop. dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and strike the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood that is in the basin. And none of you shall go out of the door of his house until morning. 23 For YHWH will pass through to strike the Egyptians; and when He sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, Yhwh will pass over the door and not allow the destroyer to come into your houses to strike you. [Cf. Ps 91:10]

#### Last Plague, First Passover

that Yhwh struck all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the **firstborn** of Pharaoh who sat on his throne to the firstborn of the captive who was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of livestock. 30 So Pharaoh rose in the night, he. all his servants, and all the Egyptians; and there was a great cry in Egypt, for there was not a house where there was not one dead. 31

Then he [Pharoah] called for Moses and Aaron by night [the 14<sup>th</sup>], and said, "Rise, go out from among my people, both you and the children of Israel. And go, serve YHWH as you have said. 32 Also take your flocks and your herds, as you have said, and be gone; and bless me also." 33 And the Egyptians urged the people, that they might send them out of the land in haste. For they said, "We shall all be dead." 34

So the people took their dough before it was leavened, having their kneading bowls bound up in their clothes on their shoulders. 35 Now the children of Israel had done according to the word of Moses, and they had asked from the **Egyptians** 

articles of silver. articles of gold, and clothing. 36

And Yhwh had given the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they granted them what they requested. Thus [in this way] they plundered the Egyptians. [Presumably in the daytime of the 14th, Passover: Nu 33:3 below.]

about six hundred thousand [600,000] men on foot, besides [women &] children. 38 A mixed multitude went up [in altitude] with them also, and flocks and herds — a great deal of livestock. 39 And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough that they had brought out of Egypt; for it was not leavened, because they were driven out of Egypt and could not wait, nor had they prepared provisions for themselves.

430 Years to the Very Day 2514 AB Now the sojourn of the children of Israel who lived in Egypt

[starting with Abram in 2084 AB: Ge 12:4; LXX says, "in the land of Egypt and the land of Canaan" was four hundred and thirty [430] years. 41 And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty [430] years [hence, in 2514 AB]

— on that very same day it came to pass that all the armies of Yhwh went out from the land of Egypt. 42 It is a night of solemn observance to Yhwh for bringing them out of the land of Egypt. This is that night of Yhwh, a solemn observance for all the children of Israel throughout their generations.

## Three Days, No Water, Bitter Water: 1st Recorded Camp after the Sea

22 ¶ So Moses brought Israel from the Red Sea; then they went out into the Wilderness of Shur ["wall"]. And they went three [3] days in the wilderness and found no water. 23

#### **Numbers 33:8**

They departed from before Hahiroth and passed through the midst of the sea into the wilderness, went three [3] days' journey in the Wilderness of Etham, and camped at [4] Marah ["bitter"].

[Hence, the Wilderness of Shur = the W. of Etham = the wilderness:]

Now when they came to Marah ["bitter"; Camp 4: Nu 33:8b], they could not drink the waters of Marah, for they were bitter. Therefore the name of it was called Marah. 24 And the people complained against Moses, saying,

"What shall we drink?" 25 So he cried out to YHWH, and YHWH showed him a tree. When he cast *it* into the waters, the waters were made sweet.

#### Statute and Ordinance at Marah

There He made a statute and an ordinance for them. And there He tested them, 26 and said,

"If you diligently
heed the voice of Yhwh your God and
do what is right in His sight,
give ear to His commandments, and
keep all His statutes,

I will put none of the diseases on you **that** I have brought on the Egyptians. For I *am* Yнwн who heals you."

Lampstand (Ex 25:31-40 || Ex 37:17-24; also Ex 27:20-21 maintenance): 60 lbs of gold, traditionally 4'6" tall. Represents spiritual illumination.

Incense Altar (Ex 25:????? || Ex 37: 25-29): once-a-year atonement on this altar. Ps 142:2 my prayers are lifted to you as (if) incense — a pleasant smell to God. Acts 10 Cornelius your prayers have come up to God. Rev 5:8 golden bowls full of incense, the prayers of the saints. Corporate prayer is special: "where two or more are agreed..." Model prayer: give US, forgive US, etc.—corporate, not individual Acts 4:24 "they raised their voice in one accord" This altar is closest to the entrance

to the MHP.

# MHP (Ex 26:31-34):

No direct description of the MHP: veil separates from HP & ark in it. 1Ki 6:19-20 Temple was twice the size of the Tabernacle: 20x20x20 cubits, so the MHP was 10x10x10.

 From: <u>The Significance Behind</u> the Judgments of Egypt



Dr. D. James Kennedy points out that each of the ten plagues was a judgment on one of the gods of Egypt. You can find his commentary on this it in the new D. James Kennedy Topical Study Bible in the book of Exodus.

Kennedy notes, "In the Book of Exodus, we see the great confrontation between Moses and Pharaoh. This is the Old Testament counterpart to the confrontation between Christ and Pilate, the representative of the pagan Roman Empire, with Pharaoh being the representative of the pagan empire of Egypt. Here is a classic confrontation between good and evil, Christ and Satan."

Consider the plagues one by one and what Kennedy says about God's judgment on Egypt's false gods:

- The Egyptians worshiped the River Nile, the source of their lives. The first plague attacked that idol by turning the water into blood.
- 2. The goddess Hekt (Heket, Heqet) had the face of a frog. "You worship frogs," said God in effect, "now see what it's like to have frogs everywhere." In a short time, the Egyptians were sick of frogs.

- 3. Plague number three saw lice fill the land. Kennedy notes, "Now one of the gods of the Egyptians was Seb, the earth god...The Egyptians' reverence for the ground having it covered with trillions of fleas or lice would no doubt cool their amorous desires for that earth god Seb."
- 4. Swarms of flies comprised the fourth plague. Says Kennedy, "Scholars say they probably were not flies, so much as they were the beetles common to that area, called the scarabaeus from which we get the word scarab, which is a black beetle."
- The fifth plague was the judgment on the Egyptian cattle.
   Apis, the chief god of Memphis, was a sacred bull worshiped by the Egyptians.
- 6. The sixth plague involved boils. This was a judgment against the god Typhon. This god, notes Kennedy, was "a magical genie that was worshiped in ancient Egypt. Here was a god who was connected with the magicians, which were the priests of the Egyptian religion. We find here that the magicians could not stand before Moses because of the boils, for the boil was upon the magicians and upon all of Egypt. So their power was broken."
- 7. Then came the plague of hail.
  Shu was the "god of the atmosphere." As Kennedy points out,
  "Now it is hard to go out to worship the god of the atmosphere when you are being pounded with large hail stones."
- 8. Next, locusts swarmed the land. The Egyptians worshiped the god

- Serapis, defender of the land against locusts.
- 9. Another major god of the Egyptians was Rah, the sun god. But Plague number nine saw darkness come over the land, even during the day.
- 10. "And finally in the last plague upon Pharaoh himself who was supposedly descended from the sun god Rah, his first born was killed," writes Kennedy.

He sums it all up this way, "In the ten plagues, God shows the world for all time that He alone deserves our worship."

Tragically, people today worship all sorts of false gods: money, celebrities, football or other sports. Some even worship their own possessions. Each of these will one day be burned up in God's final judgement of this earth, and then all will see that only the Triune God is worthy of worship.
